OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Mandatory attendance is required on the first day of class for orientation. The student must possess current N. C. certification as an EMT-Basic and Healthcare Provider CPR.

The student must be affiliated with an EMT -Intermediate level provider on either a paid or volunteer basis and provide evidence of this affiliation by written letter from his/her department chief.

The student must complete, before admission to the clinical area, a physical examination and documentation of immunizations as required by the College for all Allied Health students. Criminal background checks and drug screens will also be required by our clinical sites.

The student must, before admission to the clinical area, provide written documentation signed by his/her department chief certifying that the student has met the minimum requirements for CFR 1910.120 First Responder Awareness Level Hazardous Materials Training.
